SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans and Loan Advance

In response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, small business owners in the United States, Washington D.C., and US territories are eligible to apply for an Economic Injury Disaster Loan Advance of up to \$10,000.

The SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program provides small businesses with working capital loans of up to \$2 million that can provide vital economic support to small businesses to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue they're experiencing. The loan advance will provide economic relief to businesses that are currently experiencing a temporary loss of revenue. Funds will be made available within three days of a successful application, and this loan advance will not have to be repaid.

Points West, Platte Valley, Pinnacle, and First State are all SBA Lending Institutions. Please consult your local banks when applying for the SBA Assistance.

 - Personal Financial Statements of all owners
 - 2017, 2018, 2019 Tax Returns
